DONATIONS & FUNDRAISING

Much of our fundraising efforts this school year have been focused on raising the capital needed to update our twenty-year-old teaching kitchen. Thanks to our amazing sponsors, especially Columbia Bank and DeMattheis Real Estate, this project has been fully funded!

Our Consumer Family Life Skills (CFL) program utilizes our teaching kitchen and provides an opportunity for students to work on the skills necessary in the areas of cooking and kitchen organization. We are so excited for this new enhancement to our program, as it will benefit the entire school community. Construction is expected to begin this summer.

In addition, grants and gifts from generous donors funded the following programs and activities this school year:

- Therapeutic Horseback Riding
- Yoga
- Tumbling/Gymnastics
- Increased access to STEAM focused online learning tools
- Replacement of nearly 30 Chromebooks
- IXL & Unique Learning: online educational subscription tools
- Point-of-sale system for our CFL program that will enhance our restaurant program and enable students to take orders, enter them into a system which can then be fulfilled—just like in a real restaurant setting.
